## WHAT IS EXPLORING?

Exploring is a unique career exploration program for young men and women ages 10-20. The program provides students with an opportunity to learn about a wide variety of career fields and network with professionals already working in those fields.

Exploring is based on a unique and dynamic relationship between youth and the organization in their communities. Local organizations initiate an Explorer program by matching their staff and program resources to the interests of young people.

## WHY EXPLORING?

Exploring provides exciting activities and one-on-one mentorship for youth looking to discover their future. You will get hands-on experience to determine whether or not a particular career field is right for you, you will develop valuable networking contacts with professionals working in your selected career fields, and you get to know other youth with your same interests and aspirations.

## POST OR CLUB?

Exploring serves two age groups, both co-ed. Explorer Clubs serve middle schoolers, aged 10-13, in sixth through eighth grade. Explorer Posts serve older youth 14-20 years old. The program model is the same for both age groups: hands-on and interactive character and career activities facilitated by trained business leaders from the local community.


## AUSTIN FIRE DEPARTMENT

# WILLIAMSON COUNTY EMS

WCEMS Paramedics lead this post for those with interest in a medical career. The explorers train in basic life support skills, developing confidence, teamwork, and problem solving using real-world medical scenarios. WCEMS Explorers have the opportunity to participate in special events and rides on EMS ambulances once they meet minimum training standards.



## ROUND ROCK FIRE DEPARTMENT

The program is designed to give young adults, ages 14-20, an opportunity to learn about the fire service while providing a community service. The Post gives youths the opportunity to explore firefighting and emergency medical services, to determine if it is a career they would be interested in pursuing. Members not only get a first-hand look at the fire service, but they are also given the opportunity to enjoy organized recreational activities, competitive events and community interaction while working in a professional atmosphere. Exploring gives young people the opportunity to develop interpersonal relationships, leadership, and organizational skills. Explorers are exposed to department operations, which includes structural firefighting, emergency medical services, hazardous materials, special rescue, and the 9-1-1 emergency operations center. The objective of the training is to promote learning, teamwork, leadership and organization with a hands-on approach that allows the member to experience department operations under close supervision. Fire Explorers enjoy the ride out opportunities the program has to offer.

Explorers also participate in special events like Dell Diamond fireworks shows, Public Safety Day, Family Night Out, and Fire Prevention Month events.
