At the Fickett Center, you'll be able to talk with Scouts around the world by Zoom and Ham Radio, learn about Scouting in Kenya and Mexico from in-person representatives, complete requirements for multiple international-themed awards, and much more.



What is JOTA-JOTI?

Jamboree-on-the-Air (JOTA) – Jamboree-on-the-Internet (JOTI) is an annual global Scouting event held on the third weekend of October. Typically, JOTA-JOTI attracts close to two million Scouts and leaders from more than 160 countries! Participation in JOTA-JOTI is a requirement of the International Spirit Award.

Jamboree-on-the-Air (JOTA) uses amateur radio to link Scouts around the world, around the nation, and in your community.

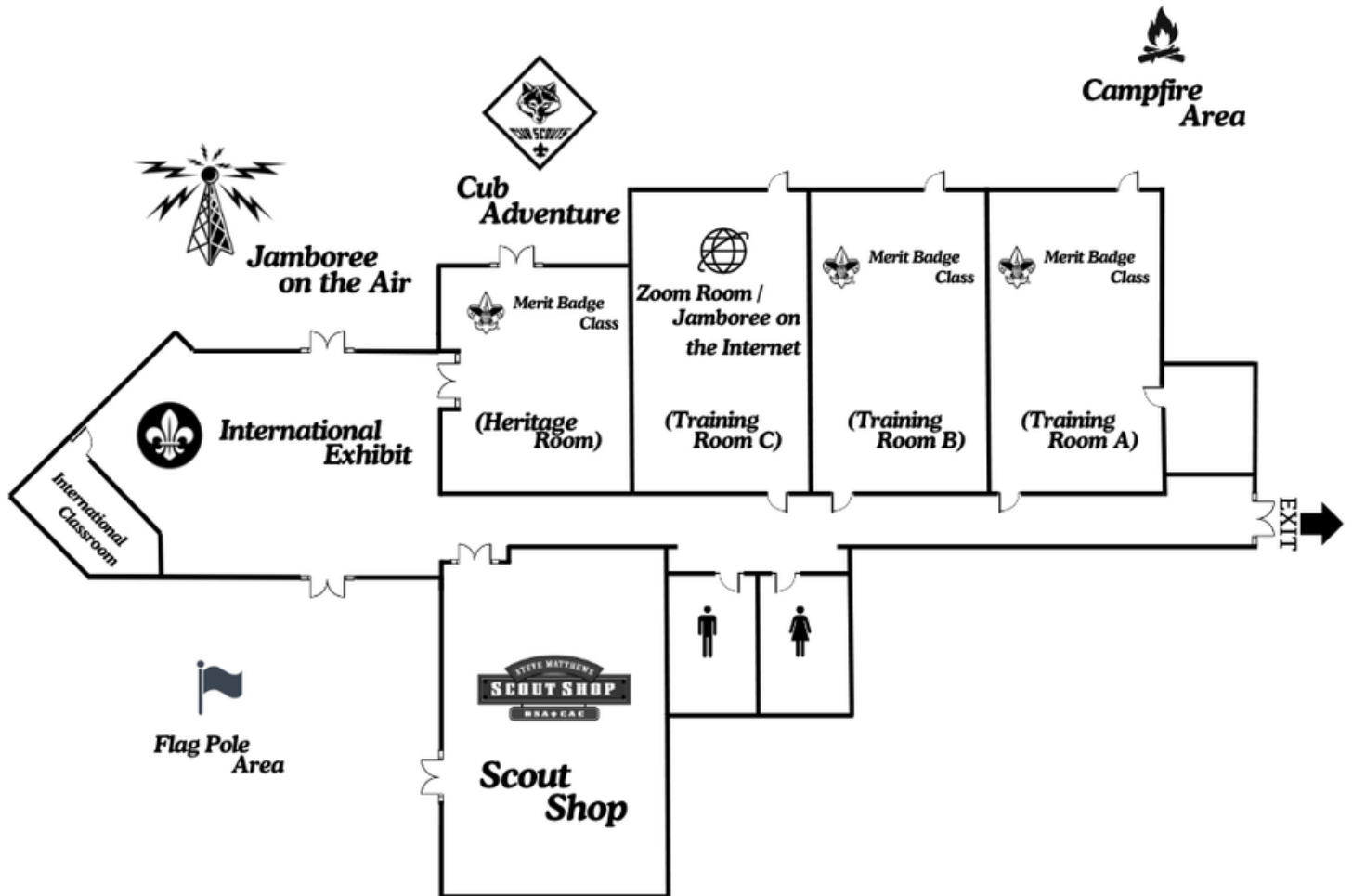


Jamboree On The Internet (JOTI)

JOTI utilizes the internet to connect Scouts from around the world. Through the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) online platform, registered Scouts "meet" other Scouts from around the world in a "travel-free jamboree." JOTI participation can be used to help fulfill some of the Citizenship in the World or Digital Technology merit badge requirements.

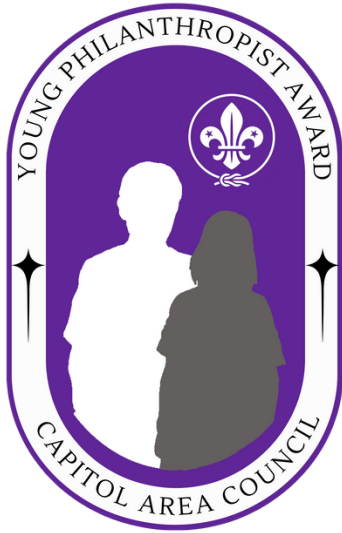

WOOD BADGE

Wood Badge is an advanced national leadership training course open to all Scouting America adult volunteers and professionals. Every adult in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouts, and Exploring is welcome to attend, whether you are new to your adult role or have been Scouting for decades. Everyone is welcome to learn and to sharpen your leadership tools to enable our youth to enjoy and deliver the best Scouting program.



WORLD FRIENDSHIP FUND

Through the World Friendship Fund, voluntary contributions of Scouts and leaders are transformed into cooperative projects that help Scouting associations in other countries to strengthen and extend their Scouting programs. The World Friendship Fund gives members of Scouting America an good turn opportunity to help fellow Scouts who are in need of their support. It teaches Scouts that Scouting is global.

17TH WORLD SCOUT MOOT TAIWAN

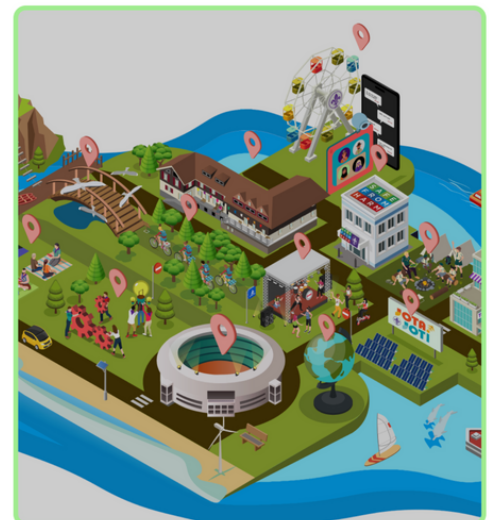

MERIT BADGE CLASSES

This is the list of Merit Badge classes offered this year. Below, you'll find a brief description of each Merit Badge, the time it's offered, a QR code linking to the most up-to-date requirements, and a link to download the free Merit Badge pamphlets.



CITIZENSHIP IN THE NATION HERITAGE ROOM, 9:00AM

As Scouts fulfill the requirements for this merit badge, they will learn how to become active citizens are aware of and grateful for their liberties and rights, to participate in their governments and protect their freedom, helping to defend their country and standing up for individual rights on behalf of all its citizens.



CITIZENSHIP IN THE WORLD HERITAGE ROOM, 1:00PM, 4:15PM

Scouts who earn the Citizenship in the World merit badge will discover that they are already a citizen of the world. How good a citizen each person is depends on his willingness to understand and appreciate the values, traditions, and concerns of people in other countries.



ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE TRAINING ROOM A, 1:00PM

While earning the Environmental Science merit badge, Scouts will get a taste of what it is like to be an environmental scientist, making observations and carrying out experiments to investigate the natural world.



RADIO TRAINING ROOM B, 1:00PM

Radio is a way to send information or communications from one place to another. Broadcasting includes both one-way radio (a person hears the information but can't reply) as well as two-way radio (where the same person can both receive and send messages).



MERIT BADGE CLASSES



SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION TRAINING ROOM A, 4:15PM

Conservation isn't just the responsibility of soil and plant scientists, hydrologists, wildlife managers, landowners, and the forest or mine owner alone. It is the duty of every person to learn more about the natural resources on which our lives depend so that we can help make sure that these resources are used intelligently and cared for properly.



SUSTAINABILITY TRAINING ROOM B, 9:00AM

Learn to reduce waste and teach sustainable practices to others so you can help conserve Earth's resources with the Sustainability Merit Badge. Scouts will develop and implement a plan to reduce their water usage, household food waste, and learn about the sustainability of different energy sources, including fossil fuels, solar, wind, nuclear, hydropower, and geothermal.



GET TO KNOW THE MESSENGERS OF PEACE PROGRAM



The Messengers of Peace program (MoP) encourages Scouts to contribute to the construction of a culture of peace through community service actions, in collaboration with community members and an international network of scouts and supports the SDGs.

Scouts then tell the story of their experience to others in order to inspire them to take action in their communities. When they share what they are doing as scouts to create a culture a peace, they join a global network of scouts also creating positive change.

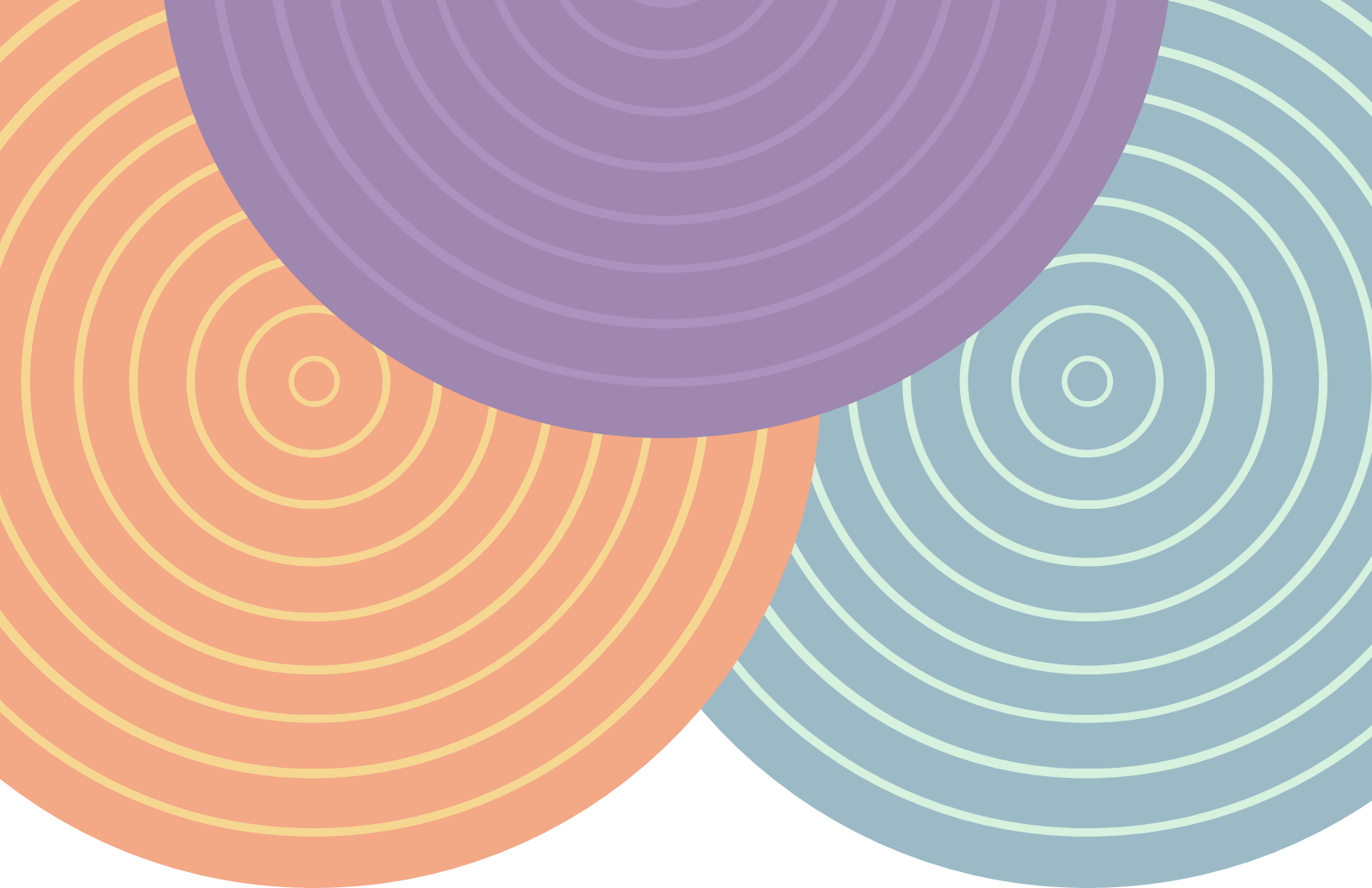
SCOUTS for SDGs

IN 2017, AT THE 41ST WORLD SCOUT CONFERENCE IN BAKU, AZERBAIJAN, MORE THAN 1,500 LEADERS FROM ACROSS THE SCOUT MOVEMENT WELCOMED THE 2030 GLOBAL PLAN OF ACTION FOR PEOPLE, PLANET, AND PROSPERITY WITH THE 17 SDGS.

WITH RESOLUTION 2017-08 (2030 AGENDA FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT), THE WORLD SCOUT CONFERENCE STRONGLY URGED MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS TO “PLAY AN ACTIVE ROLE IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS” AND INVITED “THE WORLD SCOUT COMMITTEE TO INTEGRATE THE 2030 AGENDA AND THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS AS A TRANSVERSAL AND CROSS-CUTTING FRAMEWORK, THROUGHOUT ALL STRATEGIC PRIORITIES AND DECISIONS.”

SCOUTS FOR SDGS IS WOSM’S RESPONSE TO THE WORLD SCOUT CONFERENCE RESOLUTION REQUESTING A STRONGER, MORE COORDINATED CONTRIBUTION TO THE SDGS AT ALL LEVELS. THIS RESOLUTION HAS FORMED THE FOUNDATION OF CONVERSATIONS TO DEFINE SCOUTING’S ONGOING CONTRIBUTION TO THE SDGS. THE CREATION OF RESOURCES TO SUPPORT NATIONAL SCOUT ORGANIZATIONS, AND THE FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF SCOUT INITIATIVES UNDER THE BETTER WORLD FRAMEWORK TO CONTRIBUTE TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT IS ALL PART OF THE SCOUTS FOR SDGS INITIATIVE.
